Carnivore Working Group	LCMAN started as a collaborative effort with NGOs and government. The government pulled out, so currently just NGOs. The plan is to start a national carnivore working group under the chair of MEFT to replace LCMAN. A workshop will take place in March / April, and a Carnivore WG website is currently being developed.	
Pangolin Working Group	Very effective WG, linking law enforcement with management, research, medical care and post-release monitoring. A number of applied research projects are underway.	
 Climate change and "green" hydrogen 	This is worrisome as the Sperrgebiet National Park is being targeted. Significant footprint. It was established that there are many other places to consider, that could also provide	

benefits to people, as communities are currently not involved. Areas suggested including the Dorob National Park due to low biodiversity, or mining sites that have closed down.
