Membership Support	Carry out a consultative process to develop a five-year strategic plan for NCE using SWOT and prioritisation methodologies.	Engage all members and selected strategic partners to review NCE's progress to date and plan the way forward.
Environmental Information	Develop a State of Biodiversity in Namibia in partnership with members, MEFT and other key partners.	Host a workshop for key individuals & organisations to plan and contribute to this document.
National Facilitation	<ul> <li>3. Provide support to adaptation planning, prioritisation and collaboration.</li> <li>4. Elevate the issue of invasive aliens and their restriction, control and management.</li> </ul>	A process is currently underway, being driven by NNF and Triple Capital. 	5. Continue to support the development and growth of urban environment interventions to enhance the notion of sustainable towns and city, with primary focus on informal settlements.
