	New Member Applications	 Membership currently stands at 54; 6 applications submitted for discussion and approval: 4 full member applications accepted and tabled; 1 associate member application accepted and tabled; 1 full member application rejected: Allarus Investments CC The principle business or significant portion thereof does not comprise active participation in or promotion of Environmental Matters.
	> Aircraft	 The MoU was signed on 07 August 2017. The fuel usage by the C182 is ± 50 litres per hour; Cost of fuel at Eros, Windhoek is currently N\$16.30 per litre, i.e. ± N\$815 per hour Cost of fuel in other parts of Namibia varies and can be N\$25 per litre, i.e. ±N\$1,250 per hour Landing fees at Eros are currently ±N\$300. The first use of the aircraft was on behalf of AfriCat Foundation, for the purpose of transporting an injured cheetah. The pilot was Conrad Brain. The next booking will be in October 2017, on behalf of NACSO, for the wetland count in the Zambezi river.

2. National facilitation	
 Environmental strategy - Mining Sector Workshop 	The workshop was the first to bring the environmental staff of different mines together and was very successful. Key action points raised from the workshop include <i>inter alia</i> to: Establish an Environmental Forum for practitioners in the mining sector. The plan
	is to meet annually. Useful documents should also be provided to give people guidance on compliance; Prepare a 3-year National Environmental Strategy for the Chamber of Mines; Plan the development of a "Best Practice Environmental Guide" for the mining sector. In 2018 a similar Guide will be considered for fishing.;
	 Plan the establishment of an independent environmental assessment and recognition scheme for mining with the assistance of Hazel Milne from Eco- Awards Namibia. Suggestions included the star- rating system; Improve relationships with government.
	Waste management was furthermore a primary concern.
SDGs and NDP5	Namibia has good plans and policies but, lacks execution thereof. Enterprise Namibia, a separate body was setup, to focus on the NDP5 and identify people and factors that can add value.

Ban on Plastics Campaign	The UN, under their plan can be of assistance, and at the same time avoid direct competition and together with the NCCI, be beneficial. The Swakopmund Municipality is in the process of introducing a By- Law, that will make it compulsory for all outlets to sell plastic bags. The Environmental Commissioner will bring in legislation by the end of 2017. The idea is to charge N\$ 1.00 per bag. This money will all go towards the Environmental Trust Fund. Through this, SME's will also be established and supported, by them, <i>inter alia</i> manufacturing the replacement, canvas bags. The other component is to introduce a compulsory deposit on plastic bottles.	
Carnivore Red Data assessment	The workshop is postponed to the 5 th and 6 th of November 2017, at the Otjikoto Environmental Centre, to accommodate MET representatives.

 Poster and Card on wildlife crimes 	Helga Denker was commissioned to prepare a poster and business card on pangolins, in an effort to build an outreach initiative to inform people more broadly about pangolins, their important ecological role, the pressures on them, the penalties for catching, killing, and trading them, and to offer a reward for info leading to prosecution with contact numbers. Two types of materials on Pangolins:	MH to assist with the distribution at airports, within Namibia.
	Distribution will mainly focus on the Kavango and Zambezi regions, on Gobabis district, border posts, police stations, clinics, courts, shops and schools. Someone will be contracted to distribute the material in rural areasm, supported by MET, NACSO and conservancies.	
Fishing license fees	The increase from N\$ 14.00 to N\$ 1 500.00 per month was fundamentally wrong. In an effort to challenge this decision, CB sent a letter to the Minister of Fisheries. The fee increase has been	

	temporarily put on hold to allow for further consultations. CB suggested that a letter be drafted to the Office of the President, to consider a reshuffle of the ministries: Inland Fisheries to go to the MET; Forestry should be with MET; Natural History part of the State Museum should go to MET NBRI to MET Weather bureau to MET.	CB to draft a letter to the Office of the President, to suggest re- alignment of ministries.
